

Teach your child some simple rules

- Use privacy settings wherever they exist to keep their information private help your child to set these up. Remember that the default on many sites is public.
- Be a good online friend and don't say nasty things even if it's just a joke.

Illness

Please be aware that we follow strict guidance from Public Health and have a 48 hours rule for sickness and diarrhoea.

Public Health: Diarrhoea and vomiting 48 hours from last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting: Should be excluded for 48 hours from the last episode of diarrhea not the first. Further exclusion may be required for children.

We have had children absent with a virus that is presenting with sickness for some and others flu like symptoms. We are follow strict hygiene rules in school and will be monitoring this. Please ensure you have tested your child for Covid as this is also on the increase in the area and in Bath.

We have to follow strict guidelines in partnership with other Frome schools and we can not authorise holidays in term time due to missed trips or the pandemic.
