<u>Sickness</u>

Teach your child some simple rules

Make sure your child knows not to share personal information like their phone number or email address online.

- Encourage them to only talk to real-life friends or family if they are on sites with a social media or chat element like Roblox.
- Use privacy settings wherever they exist to keep their information private help your child to set these up. Remember that the default on many sites is public.
- Be a good online friend and don't say nasty things even if it's just a joke.

Protect Your Child

To help protect your child from viewing age-inappropriate content we would advise setting up parental controls. The 4 big internet providers all provide their customers with free parental controls.

Parental controls can also be used to set usage times within apps and to monitor children's activity. Although no parental controls are 100% effective, we believe that used alongside child supervision, they will make you and your child feel safer.

I'm worried or unsure! What should I do?

Remind your child what they should do if they feel worried or unsure about something they see online. Encourage them not to click on anything they are unsure about and to tell a trusted adult straight away so that they can help.
