




Play a Game of 'What's Missing?

Place some items on a tray. Child can scan all the items and then place the tea towel over the top and the child will close their eyes. Take one item away and then have the child lift the tea towel and try and remember what item or items have been taken away. Good for vocabulary development – e.g. items could start with the same sound.
